

KAURNA ELDERS ASSEMBLY:

PURPOSE



1. Inaugurate, institute and maintain the establishment and development of an administration by the Kaurna Descendants sufficient for the advancement of the Kaurna Traditional Owners to work together as one people in self-determination in the maintenance of a framework for the long term capacity in equity and parity of the Kaurna Nation of Peoples to attain and maintain the sustainability of the Kaurna Nation for always for the benefit of the Kaurna Descendants.
2. Initiate, and oversee the establishment and operation of the authority of the Kaurna Apical Ancestor Descendants to implement and execute Kaurna Protocols to sustain the Kaurna Descendants working together in progressing productive relationships between the Kaurna Descendants and Local Government, State Government and Federal Government and other bodies, which without limiting the above would include the following:
 - i. Resourcing infrastructure for the Kaurna Nation of Peoples;
 - ii. Protocols for public occasions;
 - iii. Protection and preservation of Kaurna Nation places;
 - iv. Introduction of the Kaurna Nation into Regulation and the Legislative systems;
 - v. A consultative framework between the Kaurna Nation and other bodies;
 - vi. Promotion of the Kaurna identity, language, culture, heritage, values, traditional knowledge and beliefs as Traditional Owners, and Kaurna spiritual and inherent rights;
 - vii. Institution of sustainable economic opportunities for the Kaurna Nation;
 - viii. Land Tenure options for the Kaurna Nation; and
 - ix. Development and management of Tjilbruke Dreaming Trail and other significant Dreaming Trails and Sites.
3. Inaugurate and institute a Kaurna deliberative faculty to enable the Kaurna Nation properly to:
 - i. consider and decide upon all matters concerning the advancement of the Kaurna Descendants in relation to the Kaurna Peoples and Kaurna Land.
 - ii. communicate and negotiate as one united people with Commonwealth, State and Local Governments concerning Kaurna land, peoples and the Kaurna culture of the Kaurna Nation.
 - iii. provide opportunities for the provision and progress of justice and good orderly governance for the Kaurna peoples through the advancement of the economic, educational, social, artistic, cultural, linguistic, spiritual, psychological, emotional and physical wellbeing of the Kaurna Nation.
 - iv. foster, protect and preserve Kaurna identity, language, culture, heritage, values, traditional knowledge and beliefs as Traditional Owners, and Kaurna spiritual and inherent rights.
